**Are you a parent who applied for your children and related family members to join you in the United States under the Central American Minors (CAM) program and the Trump Administration ended the program before they could travel?**

*If so, your children and related family members might be able to come to the U.S. under a recent court decision in a case called S.A. v. Trump that re-opened the program for about 2,700 people who had received conditional approval for parole before the program ended.*

## What do I need to do for my CAM application to be processed under the court decision?

Your application will be processed if you received a letter from the government in Summer 2019 that says:

Notice of Re-Opening and Continued Processing for the Central American Minors Parole Program

If nothing has changed with the children and related family members on your application, you do not need to do anything after receiving the letter.

The next step is for IOM or the government to contact your family for medical exams, and later for scheduling flights. This may take several months. You will have to pay for the medical exams and flights.

**CAUTION:** Some CAM applicants received letters that also said Request for Evidence, like this:

Notice of Re-Opening and Continued Processing for the Central American Minors Parole Program and Request for Evidence

If you received this letter, contact a lawyer because it means the government believes you may not have lawful status in the United States.

If the children and related family members on your application have changed their contact information or have had new babies since you first applied for CAM, you must e-mail the government at [cam@uscis.dhs.gov](mailto:cam@uscis.dhs.gov) within 2 weeks of receiving the letter (or as soon as possible if 2 weeks have already passed):

- If the contact information for any person on your application has changed, the government needs to know the following information for that person's application to be processed:

(1) First and last name

(2) A-number

(3) Email address

(4) Phone number

(5) Mailing address

- If anyone on your application has had a baby, the government needs to know the following information so that the baby can also come to the United States:

(1) The name of the new baby

(2) The relationship to the family member on the application

(3) The new baby's date of birth

## You do not need an immigration lawyer for this process, unless:

- You received a letter from the government that says Request for Evidence.
- The U.S. parent has been arrested or convicted of a crime since filing the CAM application.
- The children on the application are no longer in El Salvador, Honduras, or Guatemala.
- Anyone on the application is asked to re-interview.

## But once your family arrives in the United States with CAM parole, find an immigration lawyer immediately. CAM parole lasts for at most two years. Your family may be able to apply for other legal statuses, but there may be deadlines for filing soon after arrival.
